Why

The theme this year is: *What is the value of a life?*

The Australian Government is reviewing the system we use for assessing new medicines, including for people with cancer.

This assessment affects whether every Australian diagnosed with cancer has timely and affordable access to the medicines they need.

Right now, the decision to invest in a cancer treatment is assessed using an economic equation that includes 'what a year of life is worth'.

But the value of a life goes far beyond simple economics.
